Like many of you, we are processing what is happening on the Eastside, in Seattle, and across the nation. We are deeply concerned that in our community and our country, there are places where people are not treated equally; that systemic racism exists in our communities. Perhaps you are sharing our feelings of anger, shame, grief?

More than 45% of those we serve are women of color. Many are mothers and grandmothers. I cannot fathom having a conversation with my

Program Updates

You are part of a big-hearted community! These months of the pandemic have made us both anxious and scared, but there is so much good that has come from this crisis.

You have shown us the strength of our community. You have stepped up and stepped up again. No matter how often we've asked, you have been there financially, with in-kind supplies to keep the shelter safe, and nutritious meals. Women sheltering with The Sophia Way are resilient. Shelter staff have the deepest



compassion for the women. There has been joyous laughter by the women and the staff – but there have also been days of quiet despair, struggles with isolation, frustrations about abnormal physical distance, and worry for the future. While you have also likely experienced many of these same emotions, you continue to make it possible for women to receive the care and support they need.

The construction of the **Kirkland Shelter for Families & Women** is progressing and it is expected to open in September. It is hoped that we will be able to move from the Red Lion directly to the new facility. We await word from public health about how the pandemic will affect our capacity and will provide updates as we learn more. Our shelter, named *Helen's Place*, will give women 24/7 services and resources vital for their health and safety.

Lastly, we are especially appreciative that the **Bellevue City Council** recently approved a generous allocation from Community Development Block Grant (CDBG) funds for The Sophia Way. With the monthly expenses of our hotel-based shelter costing an additional \$120,000 per month over and above our budget, the CDBG funds along with **King County, City of Kirkland, Seattle Foundation, Biella Foundation, Tableau Foundation and the community's generosity** gets us closer to making up the deficit cause by the coronavirus. We are deeply grateful.
