The Spirit of Summer

Dear Friends,

It is a very different summer than those of years past. However, we continue to look for the sunshine and blue skies to uplift our spirits to better cope with the pandemic and systemic racism that plagues our nation.

The Sophia Way hosted a <u>healing vigil</u> in June, inviting our friends from Congregations for the Homeless (CfH) and Friends of Youth to safely stand together against police brutality and share a collective voice for equality. It was a restorative evening bearing hearts and prayers for our



country to become anti-racist. Special thanks to Pastor Patty of First Congregational Church, Eric Ballentine of CfH, and Nabrath Sheriff of MAPS/ MCRC for their inspiration, and our own Dietra Clayton for organizing this meaningful evening.

You are helping us operate the shelters and day center from the Red Lion hotel until we are ready to move to **Helen's Place**, a new permanent shelter in Kirkland. Nearly complete, the 19,000 square foot facility will offer a day center and emergency shelter on the top floor, with the New Bethlehem Project offering shelter for families on the ground floor. The next 60 days will be spent completing construction and landscaping, purchasing, and installing equipment and furnishings to complete the space. With only \$150,000 left to complete the \$10M project, we hope you will consider <u>becoming a supporter</u> of our capital campaign to provide the shelter, safety and stability women need to overcome homelessness.


